2012-2013 REGULAR DECISION APPLICATION
Deadline for application: January 9, 2012

Do you consider yourself a Renaissance Man or Woman? Are you a person of deep moral conviction? Do you believe in an education that not only forms the mind, but is meant to give rise to principles of moral decision-making? If you answered yes to these questions, you should apply to be one of the *Saint Thomas More* Scholars at Belmont Abbey College. Designed for academically gifted students who have the courage of moral conviction and an interest in the Humanities, *More* Scholars give special attention to studying the Fine Arts, Political Science, Theology, Modern and Classical Languages, and Literature.

Interested students with a 3.4 or higher cumulative GPA from High School or an SAT score of 1100 or higher should submit a 300-400 word essay on one of the following topics:

1. Tell us about a time when you publicly demonstrated the courage of your moral convictions.
2. Tell us why you consider yourself a Renaissance Man or Woman.

The Thomas More scholars of Belmont Abbey College enjoy:

- An annual dinner and showing of *A Man For All Seasons*
- A first-semester reading group that focuses on Thomas More and the literary and political figures he most admired
- A second-semester seminar focused on Renaissance and Reformation England
- A values-focused internship
- Our Thomas More lecture and the opportunity to meet leading figures in the study of More and his times, or major political and legal figures who are men and women of moral principle
- An annual academic award of up to \$17,000

Application and essay for regular decision must be submitted by January 9, 2012. Once your completed application has been reviewed, you will be notified of your status.
